Finding Our Voices

At the Spring Convention of 2004, the district voted to expand the number of Divisions eight to ten. Rosie Davis was appointed to chair the alignment committee which began to meet in November 2004. The committee included Past District Governor Steve Lockwood, George Kane, District Governor Candidate Theo Black, Lieutenant Governor of Education and Training Candidate Jeannette Bauch, Lieutenant Governor of Marketing Candidate Pat Croal, and chair Rosie Davis. During the process, the committee asked the declared candidates for Division Governorships to join the committee and participate in the process. Two new division names were proposed: Rivers and Prairie. All clubs outside the International Division were affected by the reshaping of the Divisional structure. In the end, the committee mapped out an alignment that best met the distances to be managed with the number and locations of the clubs to be served. The ideas and support of the division governor candidates were essential to the eventual acceptance of the new structure. In the end, the new alignment and division names were approved at the Spring 2005 Convention held at Mystic Lake. Rosie Davis was commended for her level-headed pragmatic approach to the realignment process.

In November 2004, three past Distinguished District Governors were asked to serve on a guidance committee for Theo's High Performance Leadership Project. Past District Governor 2000-2001 and Distinguished Toastmaster Len Glaser (Distinguished District), Past District Governor 2001-2002 and Distinguished Toastmaster Cliff Heinsch (Distinguished District), and Past District Governor 2002-2003 and Distinguished Toastmaster Judy Southwick (Distinguished District) provided guidance and feedback throughout the 2005-2006 Toastmasters year, and coincided with the District Leadership planning and key decision making that would affect the 2005-2006 year. Meetings were held in November, December, and January. During that time, a list of district appointees and possible division governor candidates was assembled. The theme for this High Performance Leadership Project was "Get the Right People on the Bus, and Get the Bus Rolling."

In March, semimonthly meeting took place among Theo Black (DG Candidate), Jeannette Bauch (LGET Candidate), Pat Croal (LGM Candidate), and Kim Keilholtz (District Assistant) to begin strategizing for the coming year. One of the key issues to be addressed was the *proposed 50% dues increase* announced following the mid-winter Board Meeting in January of 2005. This issue would be voted on at the August 2005 convention. Since the proposal would likely pass, a considerable amount of time was spent planning for this eventuality. In March, Lonnie Yohannes agreed to be the 2005-06 Public Relations Officer. She caught our attention when she contacted WCCO regarding Toastmasters and lined up a 20-minute segment for the District featuring Rosie Davis. Lonnie and her team were among the stars of the 2005-2006 year.

The following strategies were laid out. First, the educational goals would be met with little extra attention. Jeannette would implement the Magnificent Seven campaign, an incentive to encourage clubs to have all seven officers trained. We would focus efforts on improving the quality of officer training sessions by training the area governors to be our

primary officer trainers. Second, we decided that we would apply the bulk of our resources to membership and club building. The dues increase would cause a higher-than-normal attrition rate. It would be higher among for members who belonged to more than one club. Toastmasters claimed that the percentage of dual members in the organization was only 2 to 3 percent. In District 6, our calculations indicated the percentage to be closer to 14%. This was an area of concern. A key strategy would be to promote the organization through public relations and marketing. We wanted the Toastmasters name in front of the public as often and as far and wide as possible. We would also create an awareness campaign for the advanced speaking and leadership opportunities within our advanced clubs. Most of these clubs had a higher concentration of dual members. Our final focus was on club building. We planned to bring in five clubs each quarter for a total of up to 20 clubs. The key was to build clubs early and to maintain a robust pipeline of new club opportunities throughout the year. In this way, we would achieve our goals and be able to turnover several new club projects to the following administration.

At the Mystic Lake Spring Convention in May 2005, the annual Sunday morning Leadership Kickoff Breakfast Meeting was held. Tall Tales and Humorous were selected to be the fall contests. Table Topics and International Speech were selected for the spring contest series. Leadership-learning and camaraderie were the goals accomplished.

On June 18th, the first Area Governor and Division Governor Training was held at Unisys. A new feature was inserted into the training. The Not Quite Ready for District Leadership Players (NQRFDLP) presented the first installment of Days of Our District. These irreverent skits were included in each of our bimonthly training meetings. They provided glimpses of atrocious leadership. The Club President from Hell ... Michigan was a hilarious look at how clubs can do things all wrong. The area and division governors in the audience laughed a lot and picked out lots of areas for improvement.

Friday July 1st marked the official start of the 2005-2006 campaign. Our first TELI of the year was held at the Prime Hotel in Bloomington on July 23. World Champion Ed Tate joined us for the half-day mini convention. ID Sherri Wood and several of the Young Professionals attended from Winnipeg. The 2004-2005 Of-The-Year recipients were honored. Scott Miller was named Division Governor of the Year, Harriet Beadell was named Area Governor of the Year, and George Kane was named Toastmaster of the Year.

In July, Owatonna Club returned to good standing. This raised our base from 250 clubs to 251 clubs.

Cliff Heinsch was elected International Director. Lance Miller won the International Speech Contest, and Dilip Abayasekara was elected International President. The Theme chosen for the year was *Find Your Voice. Serve Your*

World. The theme was similar to the theme of 2004 Golden Gavel Recipient Stephen Covey's book, *The 8th Habit: From Effectiveness to Greatness*. District 6 chose this servant leadership theme as well. Toronto was vibrant and metropolitan, a great choice for the International Convention.

In mid September, Division Contest Season was underway due to an earlier than normal fall conference. On October 22, we held the 3rd of 6 Area and Division Governor Training sessions.

The Fall Conference was held at Madden's Resort near Brainerd on October 14 and 15. The theme was 'Toastmasters: Larger than Life' and featured Paul Bunyan and Babe the Blue Ox. The colors were at their peak as we gathered for a Friday night Tall Tales contest at the rustic Wilson Bay building. We observed a glorious sunset just before the contest got underway. Earl Roethke won the Tall Tales Event with a tale entitled, "A Really Tough Toastmasters Club". Friday Fun Night featured a bonfire and storytelling by the lake.

A phone call campaign was initiated to encourage clubs to finish the year as a Distinguished Club. For many clubs, finding new members was the key to success.

In mid June, District 6 hosted the 2006 Region IV Convention at the Minnetonka Marriott Southwest. Past District Governor chaired the event with the theme: *The Spirit of Adventure*. On Thursday night Country Joe Racing entertained us with a number of NASCAR racing demonstrations. Local DJ Chris Hawke was our guest announcer.

On Friday morning, District Governor Theo Black welcomed the attendees to the Twin Cities and provided a brief history of District 6. Brian Rohrenbach gave a keynote address, *The Road to Relevance*. The District Trio attended District Officer Training hosted by International President Dilip Abayasekara, World Headquarters Representative Stephanie Demiris, Second Year ID Sherri Wood, and First Year ID Cliff Heinsch. On Friday night, we were visited by Elvis, and entertained by District Contest Winners Earl Roethke and Dave Oliver. World Champion of Public Speaking winner Darren LaCroix finished out the evening with a stand-up comedy routine.

At 12:30, Saturday July 22, Dilip Abayasekara called to congratulate District 6 for achieving its Distinguished District goals.

That was not all. He also informed us that we had finished number twelve in the world and would be recognized as one of top districts in the world: *Select Distinguished*. The award was a tribute to the collective efforts of the Members, Clubs, Areas, and Divisions of District 6.

Collectively, the District accomplished many significant educational and growth goals throughout the year. District 6 was one of the elites. Only 28 of 76 districts worldwide accomplished the Four Critical Success Factors to be Distinguished. This number was down significantly. In other years the number typically exceeded 40. This decline was in large part due to the dues increase. District 6 finished number 12 out of 76 Districts worldwide.

District 6 was recognized as Select Distinguished District 2005-2006 thanks to the collective efforts of Toastmasters throughout the District.

Well over a year in advance, we established a plan for the district to accomplish the Four Critical Success Factors. We accomplished all four: Competent Toastmaster Awards, Advanced Toastmaster Awards, Club Growth, and Membership Growth. We received additional credit for the collective work of the District: Distinguished Clubs, Distinguished Areas, and Educational Awards submitted by club members.

Our most difficult challenge was to make our membership goal following the 50% increase in dues. It took a lot of coordination at the end of the year, yet we achieved our goal. What was most interesting was the significant growth in new members - members who joined clubs apart from those who joined as part of a chartered club. In preceding years, it was typical to see growth of 7% over the previous year. In 2005-2006, that growth climbed to 15.3%. When one considers that we our membership goal by only 107 payments (0.3% over our goal), the growth was *simply amazing*. We lost a more district members (many of whom were dual members) than normal, yet added more new members than were lost.

We owe a debt of gratitude to all of the many leaders who served in 2005-2006. We salute all of the club officers. There were many success stories with the District clubs. The area governors deserve a special thank you. We were impressed by the dedication and caring service these leaders provided. The 2005-2006 class of Division Governors was a very special team. All found their voices and were truly inspirational leaders. We also recognize the many volunteer leaders who made up the district administrative staff by filling one-year assignments. All demonstrated how an effective team operates: one in which each team member puts forth his or her best efforts.

Finally, we want to thank our District Executive Committee. Kim Keilholtz, Lonnie Yohannes, Pat Croal, Jeannette Bauch, and Theo spent many hours brainstorming, planning, and reviewing our progress throughout the year. The work was fun and rewarding.

As we planned for this year, Theo chose to use the High Performance Leadership (HPL) process for planning success. Past 'Distinguished' District Governors Len Glaeser, Cliff Heinsch, and Judy Southwick served as Theo's guidance committee. We thank them for their wisdom, support, and encouragement.
